Parochial and Church Services

CCT Churches can be used for Parochial and Church services, and a fee will be payable to the Trust.

However, <u>all</u> bookings are subject to the agreement of the local incumbent who has the final say on whether the church can be used for the purpose required.

Additional Payment may be required for the incumbent, diocese, funeral director or the Church of England. Payments for the Diocese or PCC should be made to the incumbent.

Fees to the CCT include:

Wedding - £550
Blessing - £550
Renewal of Vows - £350
Baptisms - £100
Naming Ceremony - £100
Funeral - £250

 All other fees to PCC or Church of England are in addition, and details will be arranged by the Funeral Director
