

Historic sites of Teignbridge, S.Devon

• Start point: Baker's Park car park, Newton Abbot (start grid ref: SX852709)

Distance: approx. 7 miles (11.5km)

OS map: Explorer OL44 (formerly Explorer 110)

• Ease: easy to moderate

• Route: linear


This route through the countryside and woods of South Devon takes in multiple historic sites and can be reached by either public transport or car.

If you're arriving by train into Newton Abbot, it's a 12 minute walk through the town to our start point at Baker's Park.

From Baker's Park, this route travels along the River Lemon through National Trust land adjacent to medieval Bradley Manor. The path meanders with the river through woods and meadows and down country lanes to the tiny, perfect cruciform church at West Ogwell. Next, continue on to the village of Denbury – where you can take a short, albeit steep, detour to Denbury Hill Fort – before the penultimate leg to the glorious Holy Trinity Church in the hamlet of Torbryan. Here enjoy the peaceful churchyard and stunning interior of the church and take a break at the Old Church Inn opposite the church.

To pick up the 177 bus (not Sundays) back to your start point in Newton Abbot walk the final 1.5 miles through Orley Common to the bus stop in the village of Ipplepen.
