

ST JAMES, UPTON

The church formerly on this site was built during the first half of the 14th century. It consisted of a nave, chancel, south porch and tower. It is recorded that the church was seated in 1793.

In 1867 a new church was built by the main road in the village. The old church was abandoned and became ruinous.

The three bells, dating from between the 15th and 17th centuries were transferred to the new church but remain unhung as there is no tower.

During the late 20th century the tower was repaired and the lower courses of masonry of the remains of the church consolidated.
